According to research from Sport Wales, Welsh speakers are more likely to take part in sports and volunteer.

Pupils who speak Welsh
are more likely to enjoy
sports than pupils who do
not speak Welsh.





 Pupils who speak Welsh are more likely than pupils who do not speak Welsh to participate in sport outside of the curriculum three or more times per week.





46% of pupils who speak Welsh
 participate in sport outside of the
 curriculum three or more times
 per week, compared to 35% of
 pupils who do not speak Welsh.






Pupils who **speak Welsh** are more likely than pupils who do not speak Welsh to participate in sport in both an extracurricular and community club setting at least once a week.





 Pupils who speak Welsh are more likely than pupils who do not speak Welsh to feel 'very confident' in trying new sports.



 31% of pupils who speak Welsh feel 'very confident' in trying new sports, compared to 25% of pupils who do not speak Welsh.







The top three sports that pupils who speak
Welsh participate in at least once a week in
a community club setting are football,
swimming, and rugby.



 Pupils who speak Welsh are more likely to volunteer or help with sport at school or in their community than pupils who do not speak Welsh.









28% of pupils who speak
Welsh, volunteer or help
with sport at school or
in their community,
compared to 21% of pupils
who do not speak Welsh.



However...

50% of pupils who speak
Welsh are still keen to enjoy
more sport opportunities
through the medium of Welsh.



The Welsh Language Commissioner tries to encourage sports clubs to use Welsh when coaching children, young people and adults.

These are many reasons why sports clubs should use Welsh when coaching.
